## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in transfers of credits between 5 institutions of higher education, further providing for 6 DEFINITIONS AND FOR duties of public institutions of higher education, providing for guaranteed admission, for 8 <-articulation agreements, for reports to General Assembly and 9 for dispute resolution and further providing for Transfer and 10 Articulation Oversight Committee, FOR DUTIES OF DEPARTMENT 11 <-and for applicability. 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 14 hereby enacts as follows: 15 Section 1. 20	OR EXTERNAL LICENSURE OR CERTIFICATION STANDARDS.
