AN ACT

- Amending the act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699), 1 entitled "An act relating to the regulation of the practice 2 of pharmacy, including the sales, use and distribution of 3 drugs and devices at retail; and amending, revising, consolidating and repealing certain laws relating thereto," providing for medication error prevention training. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. The act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699), 10 known as the Pharmacy Act, is amended by adding a section to 11 read: 12 Section 3.5. Medication Error Prevention Training. -- (a) The 13 board shall develop a medication error prevention training program for licensed pharmacists, pharmacy technicians and 14 15 pharmacy technician trainees. 16 (b) The medication error prevention training program established under subsection (a) shall: 17
- 19 (2) Utilize a board-approved written curriculum and

(1) Be conducted by a board-approved instructor.

- 2 (3) Cover the following topics:
- 3 (i) The role, responsibilities and performance of the
- 4 prescribing physician in the medication administration process.
- 5 (ii) The rights of the individual regarding accepting or
- 6 refusing medications.
- 7 (iii) Categories of medications, including effects
- 8 <u>associated with each category.</u>
- 9 (iv) Effective management of poisoning or medication
- 10 overdose.
- 11 <u>(v) Storage and disposal of medications.</u>
- 12 (vi) Communications with individuals or quardians, if
- 13 <u>applicable</u>, about the individual's medications.
- 14 (vii) The six principles of medication administration,
- 15 including:
- 16 (A) The correct medication.
- 17 (B) The correct dosage of the medication.
- 18 (C) The medication to the correct individual.
- 19 (D) The medication at the correct time.
- 20 (E) The medication to the individual by the correct method.
- 21 (F) The accurate documentation.
- 22 (4) Include a medication error prevention examination that
- 23 requires the demonstration of the requisite knowledge and skills
- 24 of medication error prevention.
- 25 (c) An instructor shall issue a certification for the
- 26 completion of the training program established under subsection
- 27 (a) to an individual if the individual:
- 28 (1) Successfully completes the medication error prevention
- 29 <u>training program.</u>
- 30 (2) Scores 80% or higher on the examination under subsection

- 1 (b) (4).
- 2 (3) Demonstrates knowledge of the following pertaining to
- 3 administering medications:
- 4 (i) The name of the medication.
- 5 (ii) The reason for the medication's use.
- 6 (iii) Any side effects or adverse reactions.
- 7 (iv) Any special instructions for the medication such as
- 8 giving certain fluids, checking pulse rate or monitoring blood
- 9 levels.
- 10 (d) Each pharmacist, pharmacy technician and pharmacy
- 11 technician trainee shall take part in the medication error
- 12 prevention training annually.
- (e) A pharmacist who has been licensed in this Commonwealth
- 14 for less than five years must obtain a certificate of completion
- 15 in accordance with subsection (c) twice each year until the
- 16 pharmacist has been licensed in Pennsylvania for a total of five
- 17 years.
- 18 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
