## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in high schools, providing for civics <--5 test graduation requirement FURTHER PROVIDING FOR COURSES OF <--6 STUDY. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known <--10 11 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 12 section to read: 13 Section 1613.1. Civics Test Graduation Requirement. (a) 14 Notwithstanding 22 Pa. Code § 4.24 (relating to high school 15 graduation requirements), beginning in the 2020 2021 school year 16 and in each school year thereafter, each school entity shall 17 require a student, as a condition of high school graduation, to 18 correctly answer at least sixty percent (60%) of the questions 19 on a test that is identical to the one hundred (100) question

- 1 civics test used by the United States Citizenship and
- 2 Immigration Services.
- 3 (b) Each school entity may administer the test required
- 4 <u>under subsection (a) in any grade from grades seven through</u>
- 5 twelve, and shall:
- 6 (1) Determine the manner in which the test shall be
- 7 administered.
- 8 (2) Offer students the opportunity to take the test at least
- 9 three times each year as follows:
- 10 (i) Once in the fall.
- 11 <u>(ii) Once in the spring.</u>
- 12 <u>(iii) Once in the summer.</u>
- 13 <u>(3) Indicate that a student has satisfied the requirements</u>
- 14 <u>of this section in a student's academic record.</u>
- 15 <u>(c) Each student shall be permitted to take the test</u>
- 16 <u>required under subsection (a) as many times as necessary in</u>
- 17 order to meet the requirements of this section.
- 18 (d) A student with an individualized education program shall-
- 19 not be required to comply with the requirements of this section
- 20 if the provisions of the student's individualized education
- 21 program indicate otherwise.
- 22 (e) The chief school administrator of a school entity may
- 23 <u>waive the requirements of this section for students in grade</u>
- 24 twelve on a case by case basis for good cause in extenuating
- 25 circumstances. Waivers granted under this subsection shall not
- 26 exceed ten percent (10%) of the students in the graduating class
- 27 of the school entity.
- 28 (f) The department shall post on its publicly accessible
- 29 <u>Internet website links to the one hundred (100) question civics</u>
- 30 test used by the United States Citizenship and Immigration

- 1 Services and any related resources offered by the United States
- 2 Citizenship and Immigration Services. The department shall also
- 3 post on its publicly accessible Internet website any additional
- 4 materials that the department deems useful to school entities in
- 5 complying with the requirement in this section.
- 6 (g) Nothing in this section shall be construed to require
- 7 school entities to collect and report new data to the
- 8 <u>department.</u>
- 9 (h) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 10 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection, unless
- 11 <u>the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 12 "Department" shall mean the Department of Education of the
- 13 <u>Commonwealth.</u>
- 14 <u>"Individualized education program" shall mean an</u>
- 15 <u>individualized education program established under 22 Pa. Code</u>
- 16 <u>Ch. 14 (relating to special education services and programs).</u>
- 17 "School entity" shall mean each school district, area
- 18 vocational technical school, intermediate unit, charter school,
- 19 cyber charter school, regional charter school, or nonpublic
- 20 school from which a student may graduate high school.
- 21 SECTION 1. SECTION 1605 OF THE ACT OF MARCH 10, 1949

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- 22 (P.L.30, NO.14), KNOWN AS THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CODE OF 1949, IS
- 23 AMENDED BY ADDING A SUBSECTION TO READ:
- 24 SECTION 1605. COURSES OF STUDY.--\* \* \*
- 25 (D) BEGINNING WITH THE 2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR, THE CURRICULUM
- 26 FOR SOCIAL STUDIES UNDER SUBSECTION (A) AND COURSES ENUMERATED
- 27 IN THAT SUBSECTION SHALL CONTAIN A UNIT OF STUDY THAT INCLUDES
- 28 CIVICS-RELATED SUBJECT MATTER OF WHICH NATURALIZED CITIZENS ARE
- 29 REQUIRED TO DEMONSTRATE A KNOWLEDGE. THE FOLLOWING SHALL APPLY:
- 30 (1) AS A MEANS TO INFORM CIVICS-RELATED CURRICULA AND

- 1 <u>INSTRUCTION</u>, <u>UNDER ANY OF THE ENUMERATED COURSES OF STUDY UNDER</u>
- 2 SUBSECTION (B), A TEST SHALL BE ADMINISTERED WHICH IS IDENTICAL
- 3 TO THE CIVICS PORTION OF THE NATURALIZATION TEST USED BY THE
- 4 UNITED STATES CITIZENSHIP AND IMMIGRATION SERVICES TO SURVEY A
- 5 STUDENT'S KNOWLEDGE OF THE FUNDAMENTALS OF THE HISTORY,
- 6 PRINCIPLES AND FORM OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES.
- 7 (2) THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL PROMULGATE RULES AND
- 8 REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBSECTION,
- 9 WHICH SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, THE FOLLOWING:
- 10 (I) REQUIRING THAT THE AGGREGATED RESULTS OF THE TEST FOR A
- 11 PUBLIC, PRIVATE OR PAROCHIAL SCHOOL BE REPORTED TO THE
- 12 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION ON AN ANNUAL BASIS TO HELP INFORM THE
- 13 OVERALL STATE APPROACH TO THE SOCIAL STUDIES CURRICULUM;
- 14 (II) PROVIDING A WRITTEN REPORT TO THE EDUCATION COMMITTEE
- 15 OF THE SENATE AND THE EDUCATION COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF
- 16 REPRESENTATIVES WITHIN FIVE YEARS AFTER THE IMPLEMENTATION OF
- 17 THIS SUBSECTION TO MEASURE THE IMPACT OF THE TEST ON THE SOCIAL
- 18 STUDIES CURRICULUM; AND
- 19 (III) DEVELOPING A CERTIFICATE OF RECOGNITION FOR THOSE
- 20 STUDENTS SCORING ONE HUNDRED PERCENT (100%) ON THE TEST.
- 21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
