AN ACT

1 2	Amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for autopsies.
3	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
4	hereby enacts as follows:
5	Section 1. Title 20 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
6	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:
7	CHAPTER 89

10	8901. Definitions.
11	8902. Preparation of autopsy audiovisual material.
12	<u>8903. Confidentiality.</u>
13	8904. Penalties.
14	<u>§ 8901. Definitions.</u>
15	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
16	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
17	context clearly indicates otherwise:
18	"Autopsy." An examination of a body after death to determine

1	<u>the:</u>
2	<u>(1) cause of death; or</u>
3	(2) character and extent of changes produced by disease
4	<u>or injury.</u>
5	"Autopsy audiovisual material." Any of the following:
6	(1) A photograph of the body of a decedent taken during
7	<u>an autopsy.</u>
8	(2) A video recording of an autopsy.
9	(3) An audio recording of an autopsy.
10	"Investigative or law enforcement officer." Any officer of
11	the United States, of another state or subdivision of another
12	state, or of the Commonwealth or a political subdivision of the
13	Commonwealth, who is empowered by law to conduct investigations
14	of or to make arrests for offenses enumerated in 18 Pa.C.S.
15	(relating to crimes and offenses) or an equivalent crime in
16	another jurisdiction and any attorney authorized by law to
17	prosecute or participate in the prosecution of such offense.
18	<u>§ 8902. Preparation of autopsy audiovisual material.</u>
19	(a) General ruleAutopsy audiovisual material may not be
20	prepared by an individual unless the individual has the written
21	consent of:
22	(1) the physician performing the autopsy; or
23	(2) the coroner or medical examiner authorized by law to
24	perform or order the autopsy.
25	(b) ConstructionNothing in this section may be construed
26	to apply to an investigative or law enforcement officer who
27	prepares autopsy audiovisual material in the course of the
28	officer's duty or to administrative and managerial personnel,
29	consultants and contractors working at the direction of an
30	investigative or law enforcement officer who prepares autopsy

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1	audiovisual material in the course of the officer's duty.
2	<u>§ 8903. Confidentiality.</u>
3	(a) General rule
4	(1) Except as set forth under subsection (b), autopsy
5	audiovisual material is confidential. Autopsy audiovisual
6	material may not be released by any of the following:
7	(i) The physician, coroner or medical examiner who
8	performed or ordered the autopsy.
9	(ii) An individual who assisted the physician,
10	coroner or medical examiner under subparagraph (i).
11	(iii) An individual who participated in the
12	preparation of autopsy audiovisual material.
13	(iv) The facility where the autopsy was performed.
14	(2) Autopsy audiovisual material shall not be deemed
15	official records and papers of the coroner and shall not be
16	subject to section 1251 of the act of August 9, 1955
17	(P.L.323, No.130), known as The County Code.
18	(b) ExceptionSubsection (a) does not apply to a release
19	of autopsy audiovisual material in any of the following
20	<u>circumstances:</u>
21	(1) Pursuant to consent of the decedent or a personal
22	representative, except that during an investigation by law
23	enforcement or a coroner, the information shall only be
24	released in accordance with paragraph 5(ii) and (iii).
25	(2) To an investigative or law enforcement officer for
26	use in the course of the officer's duty.
27	(3) To the coroner or medical examiner for use in the
28	performance of official duties or training, including
29	conferral with medical or scientific experts, for teaching
30	and training.
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1	(4) When an autopsy is conducted pursuant to consent of
2	the decedent or personal representative, to a physician who
3	uses the materials for teaching, training or publication in a
4	medical or scientific journal or textbook, provided the
5	identity of the decedent is redacted so as to reasonably
6	render the decedent anonymous.
7	(5) To a person pursuant to a court order of public
8	necessity or, during litigation, pursuant to a court order.
9	For an order under this paragraph, the following apply:
10	(i) There must be notice to the personal
11	representative of the subject decedent.
12	(ii) There must be a hearing.
13	(iii) The court must determine, based upon clear and
14	convincing evidence, all of the following:
15	(A) Release of the autopsy audiovisual material
16	is necessary to protect public health or safety or is
17	material and relevant to the litigation.
18	(B) The necessity under clause (A) overrides the
19	privacy interest of the decedent and the family of
20	the decedent.
21	<u>§ 8904. Penalties.</u>
22	(a) PreparationAn individual who violates section 8902
23	(relating to preparation of autopsy audiovisual material)
24	commits a misdemeanor of the second degree.
25	(b) ConfidentialityAn individual who violates section
26	8903 (relating to confidentiality) commits a misdemeanor of the
27	<u>first degree.</u>
28	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
