## AN ACT

Amending the act of January 8, 1960 (1959 P.L.2119, No.787), 1 entitled, as amended, "An act to provide for the better 2 protection of the health, general welfare and property of the 3 people of the Commonwealth by the control, abatement, 4 reduction and prevention of the pollution of the air by 5 smokes, dusts, fumes, gases, odors, mists, vapors, pollens 6 and similar matter, or any combination thereof; imposing 7 certain powers and duties on the Department of Environmental 8 9 Resources, the Environmental Quality Board and the Environmental Hearing Board; establishing procedures for the 10 protection of health and public safety during emergency 11 conditions; creating a stationary air contamination source 12 permit system; providing additional remedies for abating air 13 pollution; reserving powers to local political subdivisions, 14 and defining the relationship between this act and the 15 ordinances, resolutions and regulations of counties, cities, 16 17 boroughs, towns and townships; imposing penalties for violation of this act; and providing for the power to enjoin 18 violations of this act; and conferring upon persons aggrieved 19 certain rights and remedies," further providing for 20 definitions; providing for urban outdoor wood-fired boilers; 21 22 and abrogating a regulation. 23 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 24 hereby enacts as follows: 25 Section 1. Section 3 of the act of January 8, 1960 (1959

26 P.L.2119, No.787), known as the Air Pollution Control Act, is

27 amended by adding definitions to read:

1	Section 3. DefinitionsThe following words and phrases,
2	when used in this act, unless the context clearly indicates
3	otherwise, shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this
4	section:
5	* * *
6	"Outdoor wood-fired boiler." As follows:
7	(1) A fuel-burning device that:
8	(i) Is designed to burn, or is capable of burning, any of
9	the following:
10	(A) Clean wood.
11	(B) Wood pellets made from clean wood.
12	(C) Home heating oil, natural gas or propane that:
13	(I) Complies with all applicable sulfur limits.
14	(II) Is used as a starter or supplemental fuel for dual-
15	fired outdoor wood-fired boilers.
16	(ii) Has a rated thermal output of less than 350,000 BTUs
17	per hour.
18	(iii) The manufacturer designs or specifies for outdoor
19	installation or installation in structures not normally intended
20	for habitation by humans or domestic animals, including
21	structures like garages and sheds.
22	(iv) Heats building space or fluid, or both, through the
23	distribution, typically through pipes, of a fluid heated in the
24	device, typically water or a mixture of water and antifreeze.
25	(2) The fuel-burning device may also be known as an:
26	(i) Outdoor wood-fired furnace.
27	(ii) Outdoor wood-burning appliance.
28	<u>(iii) Outdoor hydronic heater.</u>

30	"Urban outdoor wood-fired boiler." An outdoor wood-fired

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1	boiler located in a city, borough, town or township, with a
2	population density of at least one thousand five hundred (1,500)
3	persons per square mile, based on the most recent Federal
4	decennial census.
5	Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
6	Section 6.8. Urban Outdoor Wood-fired BoilerAn individual
7	may not use or operate an urban outdoor wood-fired boiler.
8	Section 3. The regulation of the Department of Environmental
9	Protection at 25 Pa. Code § 123.14 (relating to outdoor wood-
10	fired boilers) is abrogated insofar as it is inconsistent with
11	the amendment or addition of sections 3 and 6.8 of the act.
12	Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
