## A RESOLUTION

Recognizing the General Operating Rules of the House of 1 Representatives and providing for the enforcement of the 2 General Operating Rules of the House within the conduct of 3 standing committee business and action by the Speaker. 5 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives as a legislative body of this Commonwealth has a long and prestigious history of 6 7 conducting the business of the people of this Commonwealth; and 8 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives adopts General Operating Rules in order to conduct the business of the people 10 of this Commonwealth in a civil, orderly, respectful and 11 structured manner; and WHEREAS, Rule 3 of the General Operating Rules of the House 12 of Representatives provides for the Order and Decorum of the 13 House; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Rule 9 of the General Operating Rules of the House 16 of Representatives provides for the Decorum of the House; and 17 WHEREAS, Rule 10 of the General Operating Rules of the House 18 of Representatives provides for Debate of the House; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Rule 11 of the General Operating Rules of the House
- 2 of Representatives provides for the Interruption of a Member who
- 3 Has the Floor of the House; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Rule 13 of the General Operating Rules of the House
- 5 of Representatives provides for the Transgression of House
- 6 Rules; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Rule 44 of the General Operating Rules of the House
- 8 of Representatives provides for the Organization of Standing
- 9 Committees and Subcommittees; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Rule 44 states that each standing committee shall
- 11 have the power to promulgate rules not inconsistent with the
- 12 General Operating Rules of the House of Representatives which
- 13 may be necessary for the orderly conduct of its business; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The chair and minority chair of each standing
- 15 committee are not immune to the General Operating Rules of the
- 16 House; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The chair and minority chair of each standing
- 18 committee shall conduct themselves in a manner in accordance
- 19 with the General Operating Rules of the House; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Such conduct shall include respect and civility to
- 21 each member of a standing committee; therefore be it
- 22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives enforce the
- 23 General Operating Rules of the House not only on the House floor
- 24 but within the conduct of business of each standing committee;
- 25 and be it further
- 26 RESOLVED, That the Speaker of the House of Representatives
- 27 have the power to impose censorship, sanction or other
- 28 punishment as deemed appropriate upon a chair or minority chair
- 29 of a standing committee who is disrespectful or uncivil to any
- 30 member of a standing committee or who otherwise transgresses the

1 General Operating Rules of the House.
