"Hate-based intimidation." A criminal act of inflicting 3 physical injury on another individual, harm to property or other 4 type of injury, which is motivated by hatred toward the actual 5 or perceived race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, 6 7 sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sexual 8 orientation or disability of another individual or group of 9 individuals with which the other individual is associated. * * * 10 Section 2. Section 1303-D(c)(1) and (2) and (d) of the act 11 12 are amended and subsection (c) is amended by adding a paragraph 13 to read: 14 Section 1303-D. Safe2Say Program. 15 * * * (c) Program requirements.--Beginning January 14, 2019, the 16 program shall be responsible for the following: 17 18 (1)To ensure anonymous reporting concerning unsafe, 19 potentially harmful, dangerous, violent [or] and criminal 20 activities, including, but not limited to, the reporting of 21 hate-based intimidation, in a school entity or the threat of 22 the activities in a school entity. 23 (2) To establish protocols and procedures to promptly 24 notify the appropriate law enforcement agency via 911 centers 25 and the Pennsylvania State Police when the program receives 26 an anonymous report of violent [or] and criminal activities, 27 including an anonymous report of hate-based intimidation, in 28 a school entity that poses an immediate threat of violence or 29 criminal activity and creates a substantial risk of serious 30 bodily injury.

Adoption. -- A postsecondary institution shall adopt a 9 (a) clear, understandable written policy on sexual harassment [and],___ 10 11 sexual violence and hate-based intimidation that informs victims 12 and students of their rights under Federal and State law, including the crime victims bill of rights. No later than June 13 14 30, 2023, a postsecondary institution shall amend its current policy on sexual harassment and sexual violence to include 15 16 provisions to govern hate-based intimidation. 17 (b) Report.--18 (1) The sexual harassment [and], sexual violence and 19 hate-based intimidation policy under subsection (a) shall 20 include a provision that a witness or victim of an incident of sexual harassment [or] _ sexual violence or hate-based 21 22 intimidation who reports the incident in good faith will not 23 be sanctioned by the institution for admitting in the report 24 to a violation of the institution's student conduct policy on 25 the personal use of drugs or alcohol. 26 (2) Nothing in this article may be construed to prohibit a postsecondary institution from including a provision in its_ 27 sexual harassment, sexual violence and hate-based 28 29 intimidation policy to govern the receipt of reports from the 30 general public, provided that the public reports involve a

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student of the postsecondary institution.

(c) Model policy.--The Department of Education shall develop
a model policy and make the model policy available to
postsecondary institutions. A postsecondary institution may
adopt the model policy as the policy of the institution on
sexual harassment [and], sexual violence and <u>hate-based</u>

7 <u>intimidation</u>.

8 Section 2003-J. Online reporting system.

9 Establishment of online reporting system.--A (a) postsecondary institution shall establish and maintain an online 10 reporting system to receive complaints of sexual harassment 11 12 [and] _ sexual violence and hate-based intimidation from students 13 and employees. A report shall be investigated through the 14 process established in the postsecondary institution's sexual harassment [and], sexual violence and hate-based intimidation 15 16 policy. A postsecondary institution may not fail or refuse to 17 investigate an anonymous report because it is anonymous.

(b) Anonymous reports.--The online reporting system shall
permit anonymous reports, which shall be investigated in
accordance with subsection (a).

(c) Required information.--A postsecondary institution shall provide students and employees making reports under this section with the following:

24 (1) Information regarding who will receive and have25 access to the reports filed.

26 (2) How information gathered through the online27 reporting system will be used.

(3) Contact information for on-campus and off-campus
organizations serving victims of sexual harassment [and],
sexual violence and hate-based intimidation.

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(d) Statement.--The online reporting system shall prominently post the online system's policy regarding reports and investigations of sexual harassment [and], sexual violence <u>and hate-based intimidation</u> and shall encourage individuals to review the policy for more information about procedures and resources.

7 (e) Access to data.--A postsecondary institution shall limit
8 access to the data collected, created or maintained under
9 subsection (a) to only the data subject and as follows:

(1) Only individuals with explicit authorization from a postsecondary institution may enter, update, access, share or disseminate electronic data related to an incident of sexual harassment [or], sexual violence and hate-based intimidation collected, created or maintained under this section.

15 (2) The ability of an authorized individual to enter, 16 update, access, share or disseminate data must be limited 17 through the use of role-based access that corresponds to the 18 official duties or training level of the individual and the 19 institutional authorization that grants access for that 20 purpose.

(3) Actions in which the data related to an incident of
sexual harassment [or], sexual violence or hate-based
<u>intimidation</u> are entered, updated, accessed, shared or
disseminated outside the postsecondary institution must be
recorded in a data audit trail.

(4) An institution shall immediately and permanently
revoke the authorization of an individual determined to have
willfully entered, updated, accessed, shared or disseminated
data in violation of this section.
