## AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in public assistance, further providing for personal needs allowance deduction for medical assistance-eligible persons in nursing facilities.

  The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
  hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Section 443.8 of the act of June 13, 1967
- 9 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, is amended BY  $\leftarrow$ --
- 10 ADDING A SUBSECTION to read:
- 11 Section 443.8. Personal Needs Allowance Deduction for
- 12 Medical Assistance-Eligible Persons in Nursing Facilities.--
- 13 [(a)] A personal needs allowance of not less than [forty
- 14 dollars (\$40)] sixty dollars (\$60) per month, for clothing and
- 15 other personal needs, shall be deducted from a medical
- 16 assistance eligible person's gross income, as defined by
- 17 departmental regulation, for purposes of determining the amount

- 1 that person must pay toward the cost of skilled health care and
- 2 intermediate services or intermediate care while residing in a
- 3 nursing facility.
- 4 (b) The personal needs allowance under subsection (a) shall-
- 5 be increased to not less than forty-five dollars (\$45) beginning
- 6 <del>July 1, 2007.]</del> \* \* \*
- 7 (C) SUBJECT TO FEDERAL APPROVAL, THE PERSONAL NEEDS
- 8 ALLOWANCE UNDER SUBSECTION (A) SHALL BE INCREASED TO NOT LESS
- 9 THAN SIXTY DOLLARS (\$60) BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2024.
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect <del>January 1, 2024</del> <--
- 11 IMMEDIATELY.
