An Act amending Titles 8 (Boroughs and Incorporated Towns) and 11 (Cities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in storm sewers and watercourses, further providing for authority of boroughs and for manner of financing work; providing for storm water management plans and facilities for incorporated towns; and, in watercourses, flood protection projects and storm water systems, further providing for establishing and changing watercourses, flood protection projects and storm water systems and for assessment of benefits and liens. (Representatives STRUZZI, ARMANINI, CIRESI and others) – Local Government, January 02, 2024 By Rep. FREEMAN

This bill amends Title 8 and Title 11 to authorize such municipalities to levy a storm water management fee.

HOUSE

An Act amending the act of June 24, 1931 (P.L.1206, No.331), known as The First Class Township Code, providing for storm water management plans and facilities. (Representatives STRUZZI, ARMANINI, CIRESI and others) – Local Government, January 02, 2024 By Rep. FREEMAN

This bill amends the First Class Township Code to authorize such townships to levy a storm water management fee.

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in rules of the road in general, further 24 providing for additional parking regulations. (Representatives MALONEY, CONKLIN, HEFFLEY and others) - Tourism & Economic And Recreational Development, May 24, 2023 By Rep. DALEY

This bill amends Title 75 to allow for the creation of certain types of bike lanes and *pedestrian plazas.*

> An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in child protective services, **32** further providing for definitions. (Representatives MAJOR, ZIMMERMAN, AND JOZWIAK) - Children & Youth, October 17, 2023 By Rep. BULLOCK

This bill amends Title 23 providing for definitions.

An Act amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in 911 emergency communication services, further providing for telecommunications management. (Representatives SCHMITT, HAMM, CIRESI and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, May 02, 2023 By Rep. SOLOMON

This bill adds a representative from the PA Career Fire Chiefs Association to the 911 Advisory Board.

HOUSE An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in personal income tax, further 2438 providing for definitions and for classes of income. (Representatives ISAACSON, BURGOS, CIRESI and others) - Finance, January 02, 2024 (Amended) By Rep. SAMUELSON

This bill provides a deduction for interest paid on student loan debt.

HOUSE An Act amending the act of July 28, 1988 (P.L.556, No.101), 223 known as the Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste **182** Reduction Act, in recycling fee, further providing for recycling fee for municipal waste landfills and resource recovery facilities. ISAACSON, (Representatives FREEMAN, **NEILSON** and others) - Local Government, December 10, 2023 By Rep. **FREEMAN**

This bill amends the Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste Reduction Act to increase the recycling fee paid by the operator of each municipal waste landfill and resource recovery facility from \$2 per ton to \$5 per ton.

HOUSE 296 An Act designating the first Monday in February each year as Emancipation Day in this Commonwealth. (Representatives RABB, BULLOCK, KINSEY and others) - State Government, November 15, 2023 By Rep. CONKLIN

This bill establishes the first Monday of February as "Emancipation Day".

2953 An Act providing for the implementation of the child welfare case management subsystem of the enterprise case management system of the Department of Human Services. (Representatives STAATS, JOZWIAK, M. MACKENZIE and others) - Children & Youth, April 17, 2024 (Amended) By Rep. BULLOCK

This bill provides for the implementation of the child welfare case management subsystem of the enterprise case management system of the Department of Human Services.

An Act amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania
Consolidated Statutes, in Department of Military Affairs, providing
for burial benefits. (Representatives STAATS, CIRESI, HILL-EVANS and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, May 24, 2023 By Rep. SOLOMON

This bill connects families of deceased veterans with their burial benefits.

HOUSE 335 2576 An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in inchoate crimes, further providing for prohibited offensive weapons. (Representatives SANCHEZ, KENYATTA, CIRESI and others) – Judiciary, March 18, 2024 (Amended) By Rep. BRIGGS

This bill bans future sales and purchases of accelerated trigger activators.

HOUSE 336 2577 An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in firearms and other dangerous articles, prohibiting certain assault weapons. (Representatives SANCHEZ, ABNEY, KENYATTA and others) - Judiciary, March 18, 2024 (Amended) By Rep. BRIGGS

This bill bans future assault weapons transactions.



424

An Act amending the act of June 24, 1976 (P.L.424, No.101), **2036** referred to as the Emergency and Law Enforcement Personnel Death Benefits Act, further providing for title of act; and adding provisions relating to coroners. (Representatives HAMM, FLICK, ZIMMERMAN and others) - Labor & Industry, September 27, 2023 (Amended) By Rep. DAWKINS

This bill extends emergency responder dealth benefits to coroners.

HOUSE An Act amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Pennsylvania National Guard, further 391 providing for association group life insurance for Pennsylvania National Guard. (Representatives HAMM, ROWE, LEADBETER and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, May 24, 2023 By Rep. SOLOMON

This bill expands eligibility for the Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance program to more Pennsylvania National Guard members.

HOUSE An Act amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), **461** known as the Pennsylvania Election Code, in penalties, providing 429 for civil action, damages and attorney fees. (Representatives KINSEY, CEPEDA-FREYTIZ, MADDEN and others) - Judiciary, March 27, 2024 By Rep. BRIGGS

This bill provides a civil cause of action for poll workers, voters, and others at the polling place against individuals convicted of certain election related crimes.



An Act amending Titles 44 (Law and Justice) and 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 2164 Statutes, providing for actions by law enforcement; and, in employees, providing for use of force recordkeeping and reporting for law enforcement agencies. (Representatives KINSEY, DAWKINS, SCOTT and others) - Judiciary, October 23, 2023 (Amended) By **Rep. BRIGGS**

This bill amends Title 44 to ban chokeholds and positional asphyxia by law enforcement.

HOUSE An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in size, weight and load, further providing 466 for safety requirements for towed vehicles. (Representatives SMITH, ARMANINI, ZIMMERMAN and others) - Transportation, May 23, 2023 By Rep. NEILSON

This bill amends Title 75 to allow for the use of safety cables when towing a vehicle.



This bill provides tax credit for educators with out-of-pocket classroom expenses.

HOUSE An Act amending the act of July 28, 1988 (P.L.556, No.101), known as the Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste 2741 Reduction Act, in powers and duties, further providing for powers and duties of counties. (Representatives KIM, MADDEN, SIEGEL and others) - Environmental Resources & Energy, March 20, 2024 (Amended) By Rep. VITALI

This bill provides for counties to impose a recycling and waste management fee for waste generated within the county.

HOUSE 637

An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions relating 576 to offenses involving danger to the person, further providing for definitions. (Representatives SANCHEZ, SCHLOSSBERG. HILL-EVANS and others) - Judiciary, October 23, 2023 By Rep. BRIGGS

This bill amends Title 18 by changing the definition of "serious provocation" to prohibit the use of any LGBTQ+ panic defense.

HOUSE 750

An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in wiretapping and electronic 699 surveillance, further providing for exceptions to prohibition of interception and disclosure of communications. (Representatives BONNER, CIRESI, GILLEN and others) - Judiciary, June 05, 2023 **By Rep. BRIGGS**

This bill amends the Wiretap Act to allow individuals to record the oral communications of a telemarketer for the purpose of enforcing consumer protection law.

HOUSE 751

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, further 700 providing for sentencing procedure for murder of the first degree. JOZWIAK, ZIMMERMAN (Representatives BONNER, and others) - Judiciary, November 13, 2023 By Rep. BRIGGS

This bill amends Title 41 to require the Commonwealth to provide beyond a reasonable doubt that aggravating circumstances outweigh mitigating circumstances in order to kill a person.



An Act amending the act of January 19, 1967 (1968 P.L.992, No.442), entitled "An act authorizing the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the local government units thereof to preserve, acquire or hold land for open space uses," further providing for local taxing options. (Representatives SHUSTERMAN, MADDEN, SIEGEL and others) - Local Government, October 23, 2023 By Rep. FREEMAN

This bill extends to counties authorization to levy an open space tax on real property or on the earned income of residents of the county.

HOUSE 941 2305 An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in particular rights and immunities, providing for parental firearm liability for minor's negligence or willful misconduct. (Representatives PARKER, SANCHEZ, GIRAL and others) – Judiciary, November 15, 2023 (Amended) By Rep. BRIGGS

This bill provides for joint parental liability for a minor's actions committed with a firearm.

An Act amending the act of August 9, 1955 (P.L.323, No.130), known as The County Code, further providing for title of the act; 2102 in preliminary provisions, further providing for applicability; in grounds and buildings, further providing for scope of subdivision, for room or building for juvenile offenders waiting trial, for management of houses for detention of juveniles and appointment of board and ex officio members, for annual report and expenses and for appropriation and bond issues; and making editorial changes. (Representatives KAZEEM, DELLOSO, **BOROWSKI** and others) - Children & Youth, October 05, 2023 (Amended) By Rep. **BULLOCK**

This bill requires that every county have a board of managers, subject to the Department of Human Services regulations, to oversee the operation of secure juvenile detention facilities to ensure proper oversight.

 An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, further providing for refusal to issue license, revocation and notice; and imposing penalties. (Representatives KAZEEM, DELLOSO, BOROWSKI and others) - Children & Youth, March 27, 2024 (Amended) By Rep. BULLOCK

This bill provides for refusal to issue license, revocation and notice, and imposing penalties.


An Act amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions; in qualifications of electors, further providing for qualifications of electors at primaries; in party organization, further providing for only enrolled electors to vote at primaries or hold party offices; in nomination of candidates, further providing for candidates to be nominated and party officers to be elected at primaries and providing for procedure for unenrolled electors to cast primary ballots; in preparation for and conduct of primaries and elections, further providing for manner of applying to vote, persons entitled to vote, voter's certificates, entries to be made in district register, numbered lists of voters and challenges; in voting by qualified absentee electors, further providing for applications for official absentee ballots; in voting by qualified mail-in electors, further providing for applications for official mail-in ballots; in returns of primaries and elections, further providing for computation of returns by county board, certification and issuance of certificates of election; and, in penalties, further providing for election officers refusing to permit elector to vote in proper party at primaries and repealing provisions relating to elector voting ballot of wrong party at primary. This bill provides for open primaries.

HOUSE 983 2403 An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in driving after imbibing alcohol or utilizing drugs, further providing for definitions, for driving under influence of alcohol or controlled substance and for authorized use not a defense. (Representatives RABB, KAUFER, KRAJEWSKI and others) - Transportation, December 12, 2023 (Amended) By Rep. NEILSON

This bill amends Title 75 to further provide for medical marijuana and driving under the influence of alcohol or controlled substance.

HOUSE 997 1217 An Act authorizing the provision or sale of Pennsylvania milk in Pennsylvania schools. (Representatives LAWRENCE, OWLETT, ARMANINI and others) – Agriculture & Rural Affairs, May 01, 2024 By Rep. PASHINSKI

This bill establishes the Whole Milk in Schools Act.



An Act amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses), 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) and 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the 940 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in authorized disposition of offenders, further providing for sentence for murder, murder of unborn child and murder of law enforcement officer; in arson, criminal mischief and other property destruction, further providing for the offense of arson and related offenses; in jurisdiction of appellate courts, further providing for direct appeals from courts of common pleas; in post-trial matters, further providing for postconviction DNA testing and for disposition and appeal; in sentencing, further providing for sentencing procedure for murder of the first degree; and, in execution procedure and method, repealing provisions relating to issuance of warrant. (Representatives RABB, SMITH-WADE-EL, BURGOS and others) - Judiciary, November 13, 2023 By Rep. BRIGGS


This bill amends Title 18 and 42 to repeal the death penalty in the Commonwealth.

HOUSE 1059 1073 An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in child protective services, further providing for definitions. (Representatives DELOZIER, GILLEN, JAMES and others) - Children & Youth, April 17, 2024 By Rep. BULLOCK

This bill provides for child protective services.



This bill increases the pension for veterans who are blind, an amputee, or paralyzed as a result of their military service.



This bill reduces the reporting requirements for judges to notify the Pennsylvania State Police from 7 days to between 72 and 96 hours of an adjudication of incompetence, mentally defective, or when a person is involuntarily committed.

 An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, in powers and duties of the Department of General Services and its departmental administrative and advisory boards and commissions, providing for water bottle filling stations. (Representatives WARREN, BURGOS, RABB and others) - State Government, April 10, 2024 (Amended) By Rep. HILL-EVANS

This bill provides for water bottle filling stations.

An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in inchoate crimes, further providing for discharge of a firearm into an occupied structure; in theft and related offenses, further providing for definitions; in riot, disorderly conduct and related offenses, further providing for prohibiting of paramilitary training; in firearms and other dangerous articles, further providing for definitions, for persons not to possess, use, manufacture, control, sell or transfer firearms, for firearms not to be carried without a license, for prohibited conduct during

This bill treats 3D-printed firearms as standard firearms and subjects them to current regulations as well as prohibits the printing of a firearm without a license from the federal government to manufacture firearms.

HOUSE 1227 1318 A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for exemptions and special provisions. (Representatives SAPPEY, HILL-EVANS, MADDEN and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, December 10, 2023 By Rep. SOLOMON

This bill amends the Pennsylvania Constitution to expand eligibility for the Disabled Veterans Real Estate Tax Exemption Program.

HOUSE 1238 1329 An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in manufacturing and investment tax credit, further providing for rural growth funds, for business firms, for tax credit certificates and for claiming the tax credit. (Representatives GREINER, MENTZER, ECKER and others) – Finance, October 05, 2023 By Rep. SAMUELSON

This bill reauthorizes the Rural Jobs and Investments Tax Credit.

HOUSE 1245 1345 An Act amending the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act, further providing for definitions and for prohibited acts and penalties. (Representatives INNAMORATO, STRUZZI, KHAN and others) - Judiciary, March 19, 2024 By Rep. BRIGGS

This bill removes Drug Act legal barriers to syringe services programs.

HOUSE 1301 1420 An Act amending the act of December 31, 1965 (P.L.1257, No.511), known as The Local Tax Enabling Act, in local taxes, further providing for delegation of taxing powers and restrictions thereon. (Representatives ZIMMERMAN, ROSSI, GREINER and others) - Local Government, October 23, 2023 By Rep. FREEMAN

This bill clarifies that recreational campgrounds shall be exempt from locally enacted amusement or admissions tax.

An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, establishing the Redevelopment 2228 Authority Startup Loan Program and the Redevelopment Authority (Representatives Startup Fund. HOGAN, T. DAVIS. others) – Housing CEPEDA-FREYTIZ and & Community Development, November 13, 2023 (Amended) By Rep. STURLA

This bill establishes the Redevelopment Authority Loan.

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in juvenile matters, 2049 further providing for short title and purposes of chapter, for definitions, for scope of chapter, for powers and duties of probation officers, for summary offenses, for inspection of court files and records, for guardian ad litem for child in court proceedings, for transfer from criminal proceedings, for informal adjustment, for taking into custody, for detention of child, for release or delivery to court and for place of detention, providing for confinement in juvenile treatment facilities, further providing for notice and hearing, providing for questioning and interrogating a child, further providing for consent decree, providing for school stability for certain students, further providing for disposition of delinquent child, for limitation on and change in place of commitment and for transfer to criminal proceedings. (Representatives D. MILLER, HARRIS, BULLOCK and others) - Judiciary, October 02, 2023 (Amended) By Rep. BRIGGS

This bill amends Title 42 to modernize and improve how Pennsylvania serves children who become Justice-Involved.

HOUSE 1386 An Act amending Title 68 (Real and Personal Property) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in real property, providing for 2723 Pennsylvania attainable housing community designation. (Representatives KUTZ. SIEGEL. **CEPEDA-FREYTIZ** and others) - Housing & Community Development, March 19, 2024 (Amended) By Rep. STURLA

This bill allows for Attainable Housing Community designation for communities.




 An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in employees, providing for visible badges required. (Representatives BULLOCK, GALLOWAY, KINSEY and others) - Judiciary, October 23, 2023 By Rep. BRIGGS

This bill amends Title 53 to require law enforcement officers to have their badge with pertinent identifiable information visible.

HOUSE 1429 1609 An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in neighborhood assistance tax credit, further providing for tax credit and for grant of tax credit. (Representatives ABNEY, ROZZI, KHAN and others) - Finance, October 05, 2023 By Rep. SAMUELSON

This bill expands the Neighborhood Assistance Tax Credit.



An Act amending Titles 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) and 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in limitation of time, further providing for six months limitation; in matters affecting government units, further providing for exceptions to sovereign immunity, for limitations on damages and for exceptions to governmental immunity and providing for claims for compensation for wrongful conviction; in general administration, providing for services after wrongful conviction; and, in Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, further providing for powers and duties of department. (Representatives YOUNG, HILL-EVANS, GIRAL and others) – Judiciary, October 04, 2023 (Amended) By Rep. BRIGGS

This bill amends Title 42 to create a process to provide services and compensation to victims of wrongful conviction and imprisonment.

HOUSE 1486 2996 An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in public assistance, further providing for copayments for subsidized child care; and making a repeal. (Representatives E. NELSON, KINSEY, LABS and others) - Human Services, April 30, 2024 (Amended) By Rep. KINSEY

This bill provides copayments for subsidized child care to address the issue of a benefits cliff.

HOUSE 1519 1734 An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in pupils and attendance, further providing for excuses from attending school. (Representatives N. NELSON, PROBST, SANCHEZ and others) - Education, March 18, 2024 By Rep. SCHWEYER

This bill amends the Public School Code to allow students to take three excused absences for mental health reasons without requiring a doctor's note.

HOUSE 1531 1765 An Act amending Title 44 (Law and Justice) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in law enforcement background investigations and employment information, further providing for maintenance of records and for hiring report; and imposing penalties. (Representatives RABB, SANCHEZ, KRAJEWSKI and others) - Judiciary, October 04, 2023 By Rep. BRIGGS

This bill amends Title 44 to provide transparency and accountability for law enforcement agencies who hire law enforcement officers with past disciplinary actions and imposes a penalty for law enforcement agencies who fail to comply with the reporting requirements under this chapter.


HOUSE 1542 2415 An Act establishing the Electric School Bus Grant Program and the Electric School Bus Grant Program Fund; providing for duties of the Department of Education; and making an appropriation. (Representatives MARKOSEK, MADDEN, HILL-EVANS and others) - Education, December 13, 2023 (Amended) By Rep. SCHWEYER

This bill establishes the Electric School Bus Grant Program.

HOUSE

An Act amending the act of June 23, 1931 (P.L.899, No.299), known as the Public Bathing Law, further providing for title of act and for short title; providing for definitions, for water supply, for certified lifeguards, for swimming pool pesticides, for safety, for public notice, for hygiene, for violations and penalties, for permits, for issuance of permit, for fees, for powers and duties of department, for validity, for construction, for permit revocation or suspension, for public nuisance declaration, for violations and for repeals; and making editorial changes. (Representatives BRIGGS, KINSEY, FRANKEL and others) - Health, October 02, 2023 (Amended) By Rep. FRANKEL


This bill amends the Public Bathing Law to update standards for public safety.



This bill replaces and repeals the City Classification Law of 1985 to update and simplify the city classification process.

HOUSE 1615 3016 An Act providing for minimum energy and water efficiency standards for certain products sold in this Commonwealth; imposing penalties; and making repeals. (Representatives O'MARA, MEHAFFIE, GUENST and others) - Consumer Protection, Technology & Utilities, May 01, 2024 (Amended) By Rep. MATZIE

This bill provides for minimum energy and water efficiency standards for certain products.

This bill amends Title 42 to provide funding for Pennsylvania Legal Aid without raising fees.

An Act amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for veterans' benefits and services workplace posting; and making an editorial change. (Representatives DEASY, KINSEY, STAATS and others) – Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, March 19, 2024 (Amended) By Rep. SOLOMON

This bill requires large employers to conspicuously display in the workplace a posting developed and provided by the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs that shares information about veteran's benefits and services.

HOUSE 1629 2306 An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in minors, providing for the offense of access to firearms by minors; and imposing penalties.
