AN ACT

- 1 Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 42 (Judiciary and
- Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 3 Statutes, in assault, further providing for the offense of
- 4 ethnic intimidation; and, in particular rights and
- 5 immunities, further prohibiting civil rights violations.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Section 2710 heading, (a) and (c) of Title 18 of
- 9 the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, amended by the act of
- 10 December 3, 2002 (P.L.1176, No.143), declared unconstitutional,
- 11 936 A.2d 188 (Pa. Commonwealth 2007), affirmed, No.112 MAP 2007
- 12 (Pa. 2008), are amended and the section is amended by adding a
- 13 subsection to read:
- 14 § 2710. [Ethnic] <u>Hate-based</u> intimidation.
- 15 (a) Offense defined. -- A person commits the offense of
- 16 [ethnic] hate-based intimidation if, with malicious intention

- 1 toward the race, color, religion [or], national origin,
- 2 ancestry, sex, gender or gender identity, sexual orientation,
- 3 <u>intellectual disability</u>, physical or sensory disability or
- 4 <u>behavioral or mental health</u> of another individual or group of
- 5 individuals, [he commits an offense under any other provision of
- 6 this article or under Chapter 33 (relating to arson, criminal
- 7 mischief and other property destruction) exclusive of section
- 8 3307 (relating to institutional vandalism) or under section 3503
- 9 (relating to criminal trespass) with respect to such individual
- 10 or his or her property or with respect to one or more members of
- 11 such group or to their property.] the person:
- 12 (1) attempts to cause or causes bodily injury to an
- individual by committing an offense under this article;
- 14 (2) attempts to cause or causes damage to property by
- committing an offense under Chapter 33 (relating to arson,
- criminal mischief and other property destruction) or 35
- 17 (relating to burglary and other criminal intrusion); or
- 18 (3) threatens an individual or group of individuals and
- 19 places the individual or members of the group of individuals
- in reasonable fear of harm to a person or property.

- 22 (b.1) Construction. -- Nothing in this section may be
- 23 construed to prohibit, limit or punish religiously motivated
- 24 speech or conduct that is otherwise protected by the United
- 25 States Constitution, the Constitution of Pennsylvania or the act
- 26 of December 9, 2002 (P.L.1701, No.214), known as the Religious
- 27 Freedom Protection Act.
- 28 (c) [Definition.--As used in this section "malicious
- 29 intention" means the Definitions. -- As used in this section, the
- 30 following words and phrases shall have the meanings given to

- 1 them in this subsection unless the context clearly indicates
- 2 otherwise:
- 3 "Malicious intention." The intention to commit any act, the
- 4 commission of which is a necessary element of any offense
- 5 referred to in subsection (a) motivated by hatred toward [the]
- 6 <u>another individual's or group of individuals' actual or</u>
- 7 perceived:
- 8 <u>(1)</u> race[,];
- 9 <u>(2)</u> color[,];
- 10 <u>(3)</u> religion [or];
- 11 (4) national origin [of another individual or group of
- individuals.];
- 13 <u>(5) ancestry;</u>
- 14 <u>(6)</u> sex;
- 15 (7) gender or gender identity;
- 16 (8) sexual orientation;
- 17 (9) intellectual disability;
- 18 (10) physical or sensory disability; or
- 19 (11) behavioral or mental health.
- 20 "Threaten." To communicate, directly or indirectly, the
- 21 intent to:
- (1) cause bodily injury immediately or in the future to
- 23 the individual threatened or to any other individual; or
- (2) cause damage to the property of an individual
- 25 threatened or that of any other individual or group of
- 26 individuals.
- 27 Section 2. Section 8309(a) of Title 42 is amended to read:
- 28 § 8309. Civil rights violations.
- 29 (a) Redress for personal injury.--
- 30 <u>(1)</u> A person who incurs injury to his person [or],

- damage or loss to his property, has been placed in reasonable
- 2 <u>fear of bodily injury or suffered substantial emotional</u>
- distress as a result of conduct described in 18 Pa.C.S. §
- 4 2710 (relating to [ethnic] <u>hate-based</u> intimidation) or 3307
- 5 (relating to institutional vandalism) shall have a right of
- 6 action [against the actor] for preliminary or permanent
- 7 injunction, damages or other appropriate civil or equitable
- 8 relief[.] <u>against all of the following:</u>
- 9 <u>(i) The actor.</u>
- 10 <u>(ii) A person who has solicited the actor to engage</u>
- in the conduct.
- 12 <u>(iii) A person who has attempted to provide or</u>
- provided aid to the actor to engage in the conduct.
- 14 (2) In the action, the issue of whether the defendant
- engaged in the conduct alleged shall be determined according
- 16 to the burden of proof used in other civil actions for
- 17 similar relief.
- 18 <u>(3)</u> The plaintiff may seek recovery for any of the
- 19 following:
- 20 [(1)] <u>(i)</u> General and special damages, including
- 21 damages for emotional distress. Damages under this
- paragraph shall be actual damages or [\$500] \$15,000,
- 23 whichever is greater.
- [(2)] (ii) Punitive damages.
- 25 [(3)] <u>(iii)</u> Reasonable attorney fees and costs.
- 26 [(4)] (iv) Injunctive and other equitable relief.
- 27 [(5)] (v) Such other relief which the court deems
- 28 necessary and proper.
- 29 * * *
- 30 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
