Amending Titles 23 (Domestic Relations) and 42 (Judiciary and 1 Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 2 Statutes, in protection from abuse, further providing for 3 relief; and, in protection of victims of sexual violence or intimidation, further providing for relief. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: 8 Section 1. Section 6108(a)(6) of Title 23 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended to read: § 6108. Relief. 10 (a) General rule. -- Subject to subsection (a.1), the court 11 12 may grant any protection order or approve any consent agreement to bring about a cessation of abuse of the plaintiff or minor 13 14 children. The order or agreement may include: 15 Prohibiting the defendant from having any contact 16 with the plaintiff or minor children, including, but not 17

limited to, restraining the defendant from entering the place

- of employment or business or school of the plaintiff or minor
- 2 children and from harassing the plaintiff or plaintiff's
- 3 relatives or minor children. For purposes of this subsection,
- 4 the term "harassment" shall include, but not be limited to,

- 14 (b) General rule. -- An order or a consent agreement may
- 15 include:
- 16 (1) Prohibiting the defendant from having any contact
- with the victim, including, but not limited to, restraining
- 18 the defendant from entering the victim's residence, place of
- 19 employment, business or school. This may include prohibiting
- 20 contact, attempts to contact in person, by phone, e-mail or
- 21 social media, including following or requests to follow
- 22 public web pages, or knowingly attending events where the
- 23 <u>victim will be in attendance, and</u> indirect contact through
- third parties and also prohibiting direct or indirect contact
- 25 with other designated persons.
