## AN ACT

Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in facilities and 2 supplies, further providing for surcharge; and, in forfeiture 3 of assets, providing for legal representation in forfeiture 4 proceedings. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: 8 Section 1. Section 3733.1(a) and (c) of Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended by adding 10 paragraphs to read: 11 § 3733.1. Surcharge. 12 Imposition of surcharge. -- In addition to each fee 13 imposed under section 3733(a.1) (relating to deposits into 14 account), except as set forth in subsection (b), the following 15 apply: 16 17 (4) A permanent fee of \$2.25 shall be charged and 18 collected on a filing relating to a civil action. \* \* \* 19

2	(4) The fee under subsection (a) (4) shall be collected
3	and paid in accordance with section 3572 (relating to county
4	portion of fines, etc.) and used in accordance with section
5	5806.3 (relating to legal representation in forfeiture
6	proceedings).
7	Section 2. Title 42 is amended by adding a section to read:
8	§ 5806.3. Legal representation in forfeiture proceedings.
9	Notwithstanding the act of December 2, 1968 (P.L.1144,
10	No.358), known as the Public Defender Act, the following apply:
11	(1) If a person with standing files a claim to contest
12	the forfeiture of property in a forfeiture proceeding under
13	this chapter and is financially unable to obtain legal
14	representation by an attorney and the property subject to
15	forfeiture is real property, the court of common pleas having
16	jurisdiction over the property, at the request of the person,
17	shall provide the person with an attorney for the purpose of
18	providing legal representation with respect to the claim.
19	(2) If a person with standing who has not been charged
20	in a related criminal case files a claim to contest the
21	forfeiture of property in a forfeiture proceeding under this
22	chapter and is financially unable to obtain legal
23	representation by an attorney, the court of common pleas
24	having jurisdiction may provide the person with an attorney
25	for the purpose of providing legal representation with
26	respect to the claim.
27	(3) In determining whether to provide legal
28	representation under this section, the court of common pleas
29	having jurisdiction shall take into account the following
30	<u>factors:</u>

1	(i) The person's standing to file a claim to contest
2	the forfeiture.
3	(ii) Whether the claim appears to be made in good
4	<u>faith.</u>
5	(4) Each county in this Commonwealth shall develop
6	procedures and use funds received from the fee authorized in
7	section 3733.1(a)(4) (relating to surcharge) for the purpose
8	of administering this section.
9	Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
