Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in limitation of time, 2 providing for a statute of repose in product liability 3 actions. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: 8 § 5539. Statute of repose in product liability actions. 9 10 (a) General rule. -- Except as provided in subsection (b), a 11 civil action or proceeding brought against any person or 12 business entity to recover damages for death, for injury to persons or property or for economic loss allegedly resulting 13 14 from a defective product must be commenced within 15 years of 15 any of the following: 16 (1) The date of delivery of the product to the first purchaser or lessee who is not engaged in the business of 17 selling or leasing the product. 18

(2) The date of completion of the replacement or

- 1 <u>addition of a new component, system, subassembly or other</u>
- 2 part that was added to the product and is alleged to have
- 3 <u>caused death, injury to persons or property or economic loss.</u>
- 4 (b) Exception. -- Subsection (a) does not apply to any of the
- 5 <u>following:</u>
- 6 (1) An action brought under a written warranty that
- 7 would be enforceable under law but for the operation of this
- 8 section.
- 9 <u>(2) An action against a manufacturer, seller or</u>
- 10 <u>distributor of the product or the manufacturer, seller or</u>
- distributor of any new component, system, subassembly or
- 12 <u>other part of the product alleging a physical illness the</u>
- 13 <u>evidence of which did not appear within 15 years of the first</u>
- 14 <u>exposure to the product.</u>
- 15 (c) Applicability. -- This section shall apply to a claim or
- 16 <u>action brought by a plaintiff for harm caused by a product,</u>
- 17 irrespective of the theory underlying the claim, other than an
- 18 action for harm caused by breach of an express warranty.
- 19 (d) Limitation. -- If an injury or wrongful death occurs more
- 20 than 13 years and within 15 years after delivery of the product
- 21 as described in subsection (a)(1) or the date of completion of
- 22 the replacement or addition of a new component as described in
- 23 subsection (a)(2), a civil action or proceeding within the scope
- 24 of subsection (a) may be commenced within the time otherwise
- 25 limited by this subchapter, but not later than 17 years after
- 26 the events described in subsection (a) (1) and (2).
- 27 Section 2. This act shall apply to all actions filed after
- 28 the effective date of this section.
- 29 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
